#### **LETTER FROM THE PASTOR**

September is shaping up to be an exciting month for us here at Northminster. Here's my shepherd-bird's eye view of how this busy month will unfold for our worship, learning, and fellowship:

- -- On September 1, we welcome back to our pulpit Dr. Bryan Whitfield, religion professor at Mercer University. Over the past year Bryan has become a wonderful friend and colleague for me, and many of you have mentioned how you appreciate his preaching. I hope we can find a time this year for him to come and teach a more in-depth study beyond a sermon. (I will be away this Sunday for the last time for awhile. Ella and I are grateful to attend a weekend retreat held by our Flint River Presbytery for its newer pastors. We'll be at the beach with four other clergy families.)
- -- On September 8 at 9:30am in the Fellowship Hall, we begin four fun weeks of intergenerational Sunday School. All ages -- from Middle School all the way to our oldest adults -- are encouraged to join Pastor Ralph and guests each week for a deeper dive into the themes of Christian mission local and abroad. We'll hear a report on the Thornwell trip this summer, hear from three different missionaries, and explore some relevant scriptures together -- all in a fun, multi-generational setting. Beginning October 6, Sunday School will return to normal age groupings for the rest of the fall.
- -- In worship on September 8, we will reveal a beautiful new gift to our congregation, intended to enhance our weekly worship of God. I am confident you will love this one! I will give you a hint: bigger than a matchbox but smaller than a semi-truck.
- -- On September 15, we are delighted to host your good friends and faithful missionaries the Morgans. Les and Cindy are retiring after many years of ministry in Bangladesh, and they will join us both in Sunday School and worship to share more about their experience and to challenge us in mission here in Macon. I myself am looking forward to meeting them in person for the first time. You won't want to miss their presentations and preaching. (And my beloved Ella turns 15 that Sunday! A great day all around.)
- -- On Thursday, September 19, our Men's Ministry launches a new monthly lunch gathering. Men of all ages: Mark your calendars now for noon on the third Thursday of each month and we'll be letting you know soon about our first location. The invitation: Bring \$20 cash for lunch. We'll pay for our meal as a group and then what is left over after the bill we'll pool together month to month as a mission offering. Later this year, we'll select a local mission doing holy work with men in Macon and contribute our accumulated monies as men of our church. Good times.
- -- On September 22 after worship, we'll hold our annual congregational meeting to elect our next group of Ruling Elders to join our Session in leading the congregation forward. Your Nominating committee has completed its holy work and, frankly, I could not be more grateful and excited about their slate. We are blessed here at Northminster with a rich pool of spiritual gifts for leadership and service. Also that Sunday, we'll reveal an entirely new logo and look for all of the publications and publicity of our congregation. Our Communications committee has worked with a local designer to develop a new logo and look for the next 5 or more years. The session is excited about this and we cannot wait to reveal it to you.
- -- On Wednesday, September 25, another morning (10am) Women's Bible Study series begins. All women are invited to join Pastor Ralph for a 9-week tour of Romans chapter 8 in the New Testament. Interested in such a study but cannot attend in the mornings? Speak to me about building a group to meet one weeknight each week for the same study. If there is interest, we'll do it! Romans 8 is one of my favorite chapters in all the Bible. So much there to learn and live.
- -- Finally, on September 29, I am so pleased in both Sunday School and worship to welcome my dear friend and mission colleague Marilyn Borst. A Presbyterian elder, Marilyn is based in Atlanta and works with the Outreach Foundation, a Presbyterian non-profit that works to connect American congregations with Presbyterian churches and missions around the world, especially in difficult and vulnerable contexts. I call Marilyn "the best non-preacher preacher I have ever heard." She tells important and sacred stories about what God is up to around the world through the witness of often small congregations in challenging contexts. I think she will be a great friend and resource for us going forward. And she's one of the funniest people I know. Good times ahead!

Phew! That's plenty for one month. And with the Holy Spirit's blessing, all of this activity will root us more deeply in that ancient blessed line from the Creed: We believe in "one holy catholic and apostolic church." Indeed we do. I'm honored to profess and practice that gift alongside you, each and every week. Know that I remain,

#### GOOD SAM


