ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL

How to Read the Bible for All Its Worth

Ralph will offer lots of practical tips and tricks for

finding your way through the massive holy collection that is inspired scripture.

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

At the top of every paper agenda for our monthly session meetings are printed these words:

"The session shall have responsibility for governing the congregation and guiding its witness to the sovereign activity of God in the world, so that the congregation is and becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness."

That's a line from the *Book of Order*, our Presbyterian constitution to which we elders are bound, and we place those words at the top of our meeting dockets to remind ourselves exactly why we are meeting and what we are called to do.

Your session is made up of 10 Ruling Elders you have annually elected, plus a clerk whom the session itself elects, plus your Teaching Elder you have called and the Presbytery of Flint River has installed as your pastor. I serve your session as its moderator, which includes at least three functions: 1. guiding us through our meeting and through our discernment, 2. grounding our work in the witness of scripture, and 3. representing the wider church beyond Wimbish by virtue of my membership in a regional presbytery.

But more interesting than my roles are those of your Ruling Elders. In this issue of our newsletter, you'll find a summary of their deployment for 2020 in various leadership roles across the ministry of our congregation. The areas range from the most experimental (like fresh efforts to help us reach out to our neighborhood here along Wimbish Road) to the most foundational (like being stewards of our building and our finances). In between, of course, is a whole range of ministry callings involving youth, adults, worship, learning, and outreach.

In every instance, it is the work of your session collectively and each elder individually to "govern and to guide" our common life as a congregation. I very much appreciate those elegant verbs: to govern and to guide. It is not the job of a Ruling Elder to DO all the ministry there is to be done, to take care of everything that needs to happen in order for our church to be the Church. Rather, it is the burden and blessing of elders to LEAD us all in ministry; to PROVIDE spaces for worship, fellowship, learning, and mission; and to GUIDE Northminster toward the word and way of Jesus.

In this respect, a Presbyterian session is unlike many of the boards that govern other kinds of churches and most non-profits. Our elders do not meet simply to offer advice and consent, like a board of directors, their work done until the next meeting. In fact, in many ways the adjournment of our meetings is the commencement of our ministry, as we regularly look for ways to invite, include, instruct, and encourage our members and non-members in the way of Jesus. And it my great joy to partner with each of your elders in leading and serving each area of our ministry. That is the Presbyterian way: shared governing, shared guiding, and a shared gospel.

The goal? "That the congregation is and becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness." We exist here on Wimbish for no more and no less than this sacred calling.

Do take some minutes and study our 2020 session deployment. Pray for your elders as they govern and guide us this year. Encourage them in their respective roles, especially those newly ordained. Talk with them about your hopes, dreams, and ideas for our congregation in this season. Let them know how you would like to remain or get involved in their respective areas of ministry.

After all, as followers of Jesus in this Presbyterian way, we are truly all in this movement together. RWH

PANCAKE SUPPER - TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 25



- 4. Northminster Presbyterian Church currently has 195 members.

6. After the retirement of our longtime medical missionaries, NPC is ready to explore new possibilities for mission. This Spring Natalie and Minor Vernon, along with Ella and Ralph Hawkins will join other Presbyterians and Methodists on a trip to the Dominican Republic where they will provide medical assistance, help with building projects, and assist with Bible School.
