We were pleased and excited to return to worship in our sanctuary during June and July. However, with the current rise in COVID cases here in Macon/Bibb and given that so many of our members are choosing to worship at home this summer, the session thought it best for our sense of unity and the stewardship of our resources to return to online worship for the balance of the summer. Your elders will revisit the situation after Labor Day.

Session also agreed that during August we will secure the equipment needed to "live stream" our worship services, such that when we do return to the sanctuary, we will be able to broadcast the service online at 10:30am, concurrent with the service in the room. Doing this well, with a quality we feel worship deserves, requires equipment and subscriptions we currently do not possess — which is why we have made use of recordings thus far. But our plan is to have this ability in place by the time we come back to the sanctuary again, whenever that may turn out to be.

If you hear of anyone in the congregation struggling to make the Sunday videos work for them, please let Ralph or Sam know so we can assist where needed. We want the maximum number of our people to be able to worship each week.

We certainly appreciate the patience and flexibility of our membership during these strange days as we all learn what it means to be church in a time of social distancing. As always, we welcome your feedback, suggestions, and encouragement as we seek the common good for our flock and continue to love God and our neighbors.
