Stewardship 2021 Here, There, and Everywhere

"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Here. There. Everywhere.

Those are the watchwords for our 2021 Stewardship season, which begins on the first Sunday of this month. Those words come to us from Jesus' commission of the apostles in the first chapter of the book of Acts: "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Jesus lifts up three zones, three concentric circles of life, into which he sends his church. Jerusalem: here. Judea and Samaria, immediate neighbors: there. "The ends of the earth:" everywhere. Of course, actual geographical Jerusalem is not the center of our lives, but Jesus' threefold sending of his church remains for us a compelling vision of the spheres of his ministry in and around our lives. Where are the places we are called to be stewards of God's blessings and witnesses to God's grace? Here. There. Everywhere. Each zone matters, yet each zone is different.

When your session of elders started this 2020 year, we were excited about dozens of ministry plans and activities for our church in this season. Encouraged by new members and energized by a fresh vision for ministry, we welcomed the new year and looked forward to providing many ways for Northminster's people to be involved in God's good work.

Unfortunately, Covid 19 has prevented nearly all of those plans from bearing much fruit. Alas.

Yet not every branch of our ministry has been lopped off by the virus and its isolations. Obviously our weekly worship has carried on. But I am proud to say that the two other areas of our ministry together that have continued to bloom and grow during this pandemic are our blessing efforts in our Wimbish neighborhood and our regional and global outreach support. As such, our stewardship season this month grounds our witness for 2021 in Jesus' concentric circles of sending.

Our stewardship challenge? To come together in 2021 with our time, talents, and treasure, doing what we can to support our congregation's life together (our Jerusalem), to bless our neighborhood in particular and Macon in general (our Judea and Samaria), and to stay connected to at least a few aspects of what Jesus' church is doing in other parts of the world (our "ends of the earth"). We have much to report to you this month about what we believe God is calling us to in those spheres of influence. And we have a new way for you to indicate your sense of call to our ministries and your financial pledge for next year: both in a revamped and online Time and Talent survey.

Given all this, I'm actually excited about this year's Stewardship Season. Why? Because beyond budgets and buildings, pledges and payments, we get to dream together about the ways God is calling us be witnesses to God's love and mercy in every arena of our lives, individually and collectively. MEALS FOR UKIRK




In the past we have requested that the congregation furnish meals for UKirk, our PCUSA Mercer Campus Ministry.
