

Remembering God's Law — based on the Ten Commandments

You shall have no other gods before me.

For from God and through God and to God are all things. To God be the glory forever! You shall not make for yourself an idol. In Christ we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. Let us continually offer to God a sacrifice of praisethe fruit of lips that confess God's name. Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the Lord your God. Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom, and as you sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with gratitude in your hearts to God. Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the Lord your God is giving you. Children, obey your parents in everything, for this pleases the Lord.

You shall not murder. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you. You shall not commit adultery. You are not your own; you were bought at a price. Therefore honor God with your body. You shall not steal. Those who have been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with their hands, so that they may have something to share with those in need. You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will in all things grow up into him who is the Head, that is, Christ. You shall not covet your neighbor's house or anything that belongs to your neighbor. I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances.



participating in God's activity in the world through its life for others by healing and reconciling and binding up wounds, ministering to the needs of the poor, the sick, the lonely, and the powerless, engaging in the struggle to free people from sin, fear, oppression, hunger, and injustice, giving itself and its substance to the service of those who suffer, sharing with Christ in the establishing of his just, peaceable, and loving rule in the world.

The Church is called to undertake this mission even at the risk of losing its life, trusting in God alone as the author and giver of life, sharing the gospel, and doing those deeds in the world that point beyond themselves to the new reality in Christ.
