Cards of Encouragement

With most of us “sheltering in place,” I’m challenging each of our households this week to write at least 5 handwritten notes of encouragement for medical professionals who continue to work in our community despite the threat of Coronavirus. Indeed, our own flock includes at least 5 physicians; we have so much reason to be grateful for their sacrifice for the betterment of others. So let’s use this down time to spread some Presbyterian encouragement in the community. Here’s what you do:

1. Wash your hands!

2. Then take at least 5 note cards (do more if you want!) and on each one write a generic but loving word of encouragement and blessing to a medical professional (doctors, nurses, techs, etc.) Bless them, thank them, and let them know we are praying for them. Maybe include your favorite Bible verse or a quotation. Youth at home from school? Have them create some fun art or drawings to include.

3. Have your own note cards? Great! Use them. But if you want some blank Northminster notes to use, we have put a basket filled with bundles of 5 cards, including an optional "from" sticker. You can pick these up any time and drop off your completed cards in the same place.
4. Sign each note from "the people of Northminster Presbyterian Church," or use the sticker provided in your packet.
5. Seal each note by some means other than licking the envelope! Nothing to write on the outside.
6. What now? 1. If you are out running errands, drop them off in the church's basket outside of the church office, or bring them in if you see someone is there. 2. Otherwise, call/text/email me and we will send one of our driving church teenagers out to you to pick up your notes.
7. We will pool them together and then give them to our doctors (and others) to pass them out to staff in offices, hospitals, and clinics. A public ministry of encouragement!

DO NOT hesitate to reach out to me on any of these steps. Team effort! Thanks a million.
