Affirmation of Faith — Presbyterian Study Catechism

Question 1. What is God's purpose for my life?

God wills that we should live by the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, for the love of God, and in the communion of the Holy Spirit.

Question 2. How do we live by the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ?

We are not our own. We have been bought with a price. The Lord Jesus Christ loved us and gave himself for us. We entrust ourselves completely to his care, giving thanks each day for his wonderful goodness.

Ouestion 3. How do we live for the love of God?

We love because God first loved us. God loves me in Christ with a love that never ends. Amazed by grace, I no longer live for myself. I live for the Lord who died and rose again, triumphant over death, for my sake. Therefore, we take those around us to heart, especially those in particular need, knowing that Christ died for them no less than for us.

Question 4. How do we live in the communion of the Holy Spirit?

By the Holy Spirit, we are made one with the Lord Jesus Christ. We are baptized into Christ's body, the church, along with all others who confess him by faith. As members of this community, we trust in God's Word, share in the Lord's Supper, and turn to God constantly in prayer. As we grow in grace and knowledge, we are led to do the good works that God intends for our lives.
