FINANCIAL SUMMARY - JANUARY 2023

As of January 31, NPC has...

- received \$60,438.72 in pledges, which is \$29,653.72 more than the \$30,785 expected in Jan 2023.
- received \$1,935 from regular (no pledge) givers, which is \$65.00 less than the \$2000 expected in Jan 2023.
- received \$1,206.70 in loose offerings, which is \$206.70 more than the \$1000 expected in 2022.
- received \$1,318.28 in offerings for unbudgeted and outreach programs.
- has spent \$43,201.74 which is \$6,049.38 more than the \$37,152.36 that was planned to be spent this year.
- received \$64,898.00 in total income (*excluding the \$12,000 in fraudulent activity) and has spent a total of \$43,201.74 which left us with a surplus of \$21,696.26.
