

FINANCIAL SUMMARY - FEBRUARY 2023

As of February 28, NPC has:

- Received \$75,653.91 in pledges
- Received \$6,625 from regular (no pledge) givers
- Received \$2,619.71 in loose offerings
- Received \$2, 544.95 for outreach programs
- Spent \$78,561.24 on budgeted and outreach

*Summary: NPC has received \$87,257.00 in total income and has spent a total of \$78,561.24 which leaves us with a surplus of \$8,696.75
