# FINANCIAL SUMMARY - MARCH 2023

As of March 31, NPC has:

- Received \$100,705.91 in pledges
- Received \$8,685 from regular (no pledge) givers
- Received \$5,941.71 in loose offerings
- Received \$3,672.99 for outreach programs
- Spent \$121,911.74 on budgeted and outreach expenses

\*Summary: NPC has received \$119,005.61 in total income and has spent a total of \$121,911.74 which leaves us with a deficit of \$2,906.13
