
FROM OUR PASTOR


Women's Retreat Exploring and Expanding our Images of God

Green Professor of Theology at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta.

With the office area of our building now 99% returned to service, our focus has shifted to the replacement of the steeple. The new steeple itself has been constructed (see photos taken in a warehouse in Kentucky), and as of September 1 masons are making repairs to the brickwork at the top of our steeple tower in order to receive the new steel base (which has been in our yard for a month) and the steeple. The new steeple structure will arrive in one piece via a tractor-trailer truck. We plan to have a Steeple Raising Party when the day for installation comes. You'll be the first to know when that takes place!

As of July 31, NPC has:

- Received \$228,258.04 in pledges
- Received \$28,295.00 from regular (no pledge) givers
- Received \$11,611.48 in loose offerings

- Spent \$268,382.80 on budgeted and outreach expenses
