Human love is directed to the other person for his own sake, spiritual love loves him for Christ's sake. Therefore, human love seeks direct contact with the other person; it loves him not as a free person but as one whom it binds to itself. It wants to gain, to capture by every means; it uses force. It desires to be irresistible, to rule. Spiritual love asks nothing in return, but seeks those who need it. And who needs our love more than those who are consumed with hatred and are utterly devoid of love.

God is in the manger, wealth in poverty, light in darkness, succor in abandonment. No evil can befall us; whatever men may do to us, they cannot but serve the God who is secretly revealed as love and rules the world and our lives.

I LOVE You Just the Way I am



After saying this, Jesus was troubled in spirit. He explained why. "I'm telling you the solemn truth," he said. "One of you will betray me."

"Do it quickly, won't you?" said Jesus to him.

None of the others at the table knew what he meant. So when Judas had taken the bread, he went out at once. It was night. When Judas had gone out, Jesus began to speak.

So I give you a new command: Love each other deeply and fully. Remember the ways that I have loved you, and demonstrate your love for others in those same ways. Everyone will know you as My followers if you demonstrate your love to others.

The Voice paraphrase

Let me give you a new command: Love one another. In the same way I loved you, you love one another. This is how everyone will recognize that you are my disciples—when they see the love you have for each other.

The Message paraphrase

What is new, therefore, is not the commandment to love, because that commandment lies at the heart of the Torah (Lev 19:18; Deut 6:4). Rather, what is new is that the commandment to love derives from the incarnation. The "new" turn in the commandment of 13:34 is that Jesus' "own" are asked to enter into the love that marks the relationship [Vol. 9, p. 733] of God and Jesus. Their participation in this relationship will be evidenced the same way that Jesus' is: by acts of love that join the believer to God. Keeping this commandment is the identifying mark of discipleship, because it is the tangible sign of the disciples' abiding in Jesus.

New Interpreter's Bible commentary

Agape love is what emerges from the refiner's fire when that surging desire to cling, possess, consume the object of one's adoring is subjected to the discipline of kenosis, self-giving love.
