FINANCIAL SUMMARY - JANUARY 2024

As of February 29, NPC has:

- Received \$78,797.41 in pledges.
- Received \$30,965.00 from the 2024 January Pledge Challenge
- Received \$20,934.39 from regular (no pledge) givers.
- Received \$418 in loose offerings.
- Received \$8,084.21 for outreach programs
- Spent \$76,627.10 on total expenses which is \$7,023.16 more than the \$69,603.94 budgeted.
- Summary: NPC has received 139,199.01 in total income and has spent a total of \$76,627.10.

WORDS FROM PASTOR RALPH

Since during Holy Week I filled your email inboxes with lots of preacher-prose, for our April newsletter allow me simply to offer some brief updates and celebrations:

- I know members will join me in thanking Gunner and our choir for their great musical contributions to Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday. The styles were varied but the offerings were universally rich. Choir: We thank you for your time and talent.
- With the repair of the front sidewalk now completed (damaged when the crane arrived to dismantle the steeple wreckage), I'm delighted to report that our beloved building is 100 percent repaired from the tornado damage two years ago. We will always owe the Moselys, Mark Brown, Jennifer—and many others along the way—a debt of great gratitude for seeing us through this long journey of rehabilitation.
- And speaking of our building, on Christmas Eve our sanctuary chandeliers decided they deserved a holiday. Turns out, the entire sanctuary lighting control system built in 1980 was on its last leg—the chandeliers simply being the first circuit to go. Original estimates for a space-age control system approached 50k, but our intrepid electrician Jeff Williams proposed a simplified system made up of parts available locally. Even then, the replacement wiring project came in at \$18,000. But guess what? An amazing church member made an anonymous donation and covered the entire cost. I say Amen to the comment of one of your elders: "The generosity of this congregation never ceases to amaze me."
- This spring all of our church committees are in full swing, and our next church-wide committee meeting Sunday is April 14 after worship. We'll spread out a little more this time, but everyone meeting in the same hour proved great for morale! Thanks all.
- Special thanks this spring to Rosie Miles, Chloe Napier, Lynn and Hannah Denny, Virginia Cowsert, and elder Donna Shufford for really stepping up with our children and youth in recent weeks. We appreciate all you are doing to help us all honor the vows we make as a congregation to our children at baptism.
- And a shout-out to Jeanne Roddenberry for leading discussions each Wednesday morning for our Lenten Ladies Bible Study! It takes a superstar like Jeanne to make an old man like Brother Bailey interesting and fun! Aramaic, anyone?
- With the session's blessing, in November I gathered all of our "middle-aged" members for a lunch meeting to begin discussions with them about the next 5+ years of our congregation. It was a fun and fruitful discussion, agreeing on our many blessings and charting out some of our urgent needs. Round 2 of that discussion happens April 21 after worship. I'm grateful to our 30, 40, and 50-somethings for helping the session look ahead.
- Finally, I want to remind you about my weekly pattern of ministry, now that I live with Deb in Kathleen. Most Mondays I work from home: worship planning and preaching/teaching prep. Most Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays I am in the church office at least part of the day. Most Fridays are a personal day. Saturdays often include church or presbytery activities, and Sundays are, blessedly, a full day of ministry. Notice all the "mosts!" Every week is a little different in the pastoral work, depending on a host of factors. But here's the bottom line for me: Always reach out whenever you would like to connect for conversation, visitation, and prayer. Text, phone, e-mail, social media, via Jennifer ... however you get to me, please get to me, so we can schedule a time to visit in person. I delight in conversation and aim to serve you in your spiritual pilgrimage with Jesus. Although every week is fluid, I trust you know after five years together that I will always make you my precious priority.

So there's a little Resurrection Roundup for the unfolding Easter season.

I continue to give thanks to God for the great privilege of being your pastor in this time.
