
SUNDAY, MAY 12

PCUSA Special Offerings - Pentecost

A foundation of faith established during childhood helps ensure lifelong faith and service. The patterns and lessons established during these formative years continue to bear fruit throughout a person's life. By receiving the Pentecost Offering, you are nurturing the faith of those who are the church to come — children, youth, and young adults. 40% of this offering stays within our congregation for the children and youth ministries. 25% support Young Adult Volunteers,

25% to support ministries with youth, and 10% is devoted to children at-risk. This offering will be collected Sunday, May 19th.
