Call to Worship - based on Luke 24:28-36

When we come to our Lord's table, we remember those early disciples, on the road to Emmaus. Not yet recognizing the risen Jesus, they nevertheless invite him to join them as a guest:

"Please, be our guest. It's getting late, and soon it will be too dark to walk."

In that same spirit, let us welcome the risen Christ among us we worship in this hour. Come, dear Jesus, lend us your Spirit as we gather in the shelter of your good news.

When they sit down at the table for dinner, Jesus takes the bread in his hands. He gives thanks for it, and then he breaks it and gives it to them.

At that instant, their eyes are suddenly opened so they recognize Him.

They went and told the others what they experienced:

"The Lord has risen indeed, and he has appeared to us!"

As it was for them then, may it be so for us today:

that he would be made known to us in the breaking of our bread.
