Tuesday, March 4th at 6pm




MEN'S BREAKFAST - MARCH 12

We are partnering with Rev. Pedro Radney and his congregation to support his vision for an afterschool baseball program to minister to boys in his community. Currently more than 50 youth are involved! We worked on the first of two dugouts to improve the baseball field. We also conducted two medical clinics that served more than 150 patients from the community. It was a wonderful visit, and there is already
